


On-Resistance vs. Drain Current and Gate Voltage



Capacitance




**Gate Charge** 




On-Resistance vs. Junction Temperature







Source-Drain Diode Forward Voltage




**Threshold Voltage** 



On-Resistance vs. Gate-to-Source Voltage




Single Pulse Power, Junction-to-Ambient




Safe Operating Area, Junction-to-Ambient








#### Normalized Thermal Transient Impedance, Junction-to-Ambient



#### Normalized Thermal Transient Impedance, Junction-to-Case (Drain)

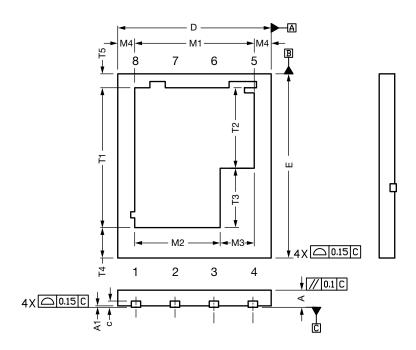


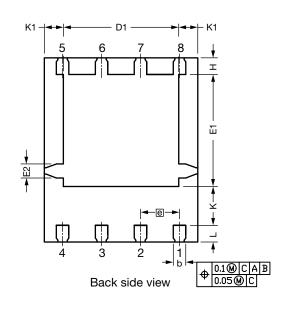
